NEW PROJECTS TAKEN UP DURING THE YEAR 2000-2001

Project 1: Conservation and propagation techniques for rare and endangered medicinal and aromatic plants of Eastern Ghats.

Objectives : (a) To standardise propagation techniques and mass multiplication of medicinal and aromatic plants of Eastern Ghats. (b) *In-situ* and *ex-situ* conservation of quality stock.

Progress made : Literature survey completed. Three medicinal plants namely *Commiphora agallocha*, *Rauvolfia serpentina* and *Gymnema sylvestre* collected and have been introduced in FRC Hyderabad.
