He also urged about the importance of commercially valuable MAPs and scientist should work on its sustainable harvesting to end product.





Webinar was started with Guest speaker, Dr. P. K. Shukla Regional Director, Regional Cum Facilitation Centre for MAPs(NMPB), Jabalpur (MP) delivered in his lecture on **“NTFPs in Central India: An Overview”**. He elaborated about the word MFP to NTFPs. He emphasized the importance of NTFPs including small timber, grasses, leaves, medicinal herbs, gums , tan and dyes, animal origin NTFPs, status of production of different NTFPs, cultivation, primary processing, conservation of RET species, its domestication, sustainable harvesting of barks, leaves, plant products as well as its bio-chemical evaluation and its testing.






During the webinar, Second speaker Dr. Narendra Kumar, Scientist, Central Institute of Medicinal & Aromatic Plants (CIMAP), Lucknow (UP) delivered his lecture on 'Processing and value addition of NTFPs'. He elaborated to collect the dust and disease free MAPs and should be avoid to collect near the road. He also opined on primary processing and its storage in proper techniques. Further, he informed about the herbal products such as Balm, Skin ointment, Antidandruf Shampoo developed by the CIMAP, Lucknow which are available in market.


