21st Session of Asia Pacific Forestry Commission 2006 at ICFRE

Asia Pacific Forestry Commission (APFC) which meets every two years, is one of six Regional Forestry Commissions established by the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) to provide a policy and technical forum for countries to discuss forestry issues on a regional basis. The FAO and the Ministry of Environment and Forests (MoEF), Government of India organized 21st session of APFC at the Headquarters of Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE), Dehradun from 17th to 21st April, 2006. Representatives from 29 member countries, 3 members from United Nations along with observers, representatives from 3 non-member countries and 25 regional International Intergovernmental and Nongovernmental organizations participated







in the session along with Indian delegation.

Shri G. K. Prasad, Additional Inspector General, Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India and Director General, Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education, Dehradun welcomed the participants on behalf of the Government of India. Shri J. C. Kala, Director General of Forests and Special Secretary, Ministry of Environment and







Forests, Government of India addressed the participants and outlined the sailent forestry programmes of the Government of India. Mr. He Changchui, Assistant Director General and Regional Representative for Asia and the Pacific, welcomed participants on behalf of the Director General of FAO. Mr. Wulf Killmann, Director of the Forest Products and Economic Division represented the Forestry Department of FAO.

Dr. R. K. Pachauri, Director General, Tata Energy and Resources Institute (TERI) and Chairman, Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, delivered the keynote address.

Shri Narayan Dutt Tiwari, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Uttaranchal, presided over the function and delivered the presidential address. Shri Namo Narain Meena, Hon'ble Minister of State for Environment and Forests, Government of India, delivered the inaugural address and vote of thanks was delivered by Dr. Shashi Kumar, Director (Research), ICFRE and Chairman, Organizing Committee.

The commission unanimously elected Shri J.C. Kala, Director General of

Forests and Special Secretary, MoEF as Chairperson to hold the office until commencement of the twenty second session.

A special session was held to discuss the progress towards sustainable forest management, where regional results of the Global Forest Resources Assessment 2005 and recent developments and issues undertaken by the countries were discussed. The commission held a special in-session seminar on payment for environmental services and presession workshop on forests and poverty reduction. The commission considered the use of innovative financing such as the payment of environmental services and the role of regional mechanisms in promoting sustainable forest management. Delegates further discussed codes of practices for planting forests; forest harvesting, forest genetic resources, invasive species, and wild land fires, and the FAO/ITTO guidelines best practices on law compliance in the forest sector. The session ended with appreciation for the offer of the delegation from Vietnam to host its twenty second session at Vietnam.



Community based forestry project launched in Bihar

An integrated community based forest management project sponsored by Planning Commission of India was launched in Bihar state during March. 2006. The ICFRE and its institute will execute activity in active collaboration with the State Forest Department of Bihar. The first phase of the project from 2005-2006 to 2006-2007 for Rs. 51 crores has been initiated with an objective of increasing forest cover and promotion of agroforestry to meet day-to-day needs, economic and ecological well being of the rural population in north and south Bihar. ICFRE will be looking after the agroforestry component of the project and will be implemented mainly in North Bihar. State Forest Department will be implementing rehabilitation of the degraded forests in south Bihar. During phase - I agro forestry component will be implemented by Institute of Forest Productivity (IFP), Ranchi with the technical support of Forest Research Institute (FRI), Dehradun and Tropical Forest Research Institute (TFRI), Jabalpur, in Vaishali District and the rehabilitation of degraded forests (RDF) will be implemented by Banka Forest Division of Bihar Forest Department.

Phase-2 of the project for Rs. 252.33 crores is proposed to be implemented from 2007-2008 to 2011-2012.
