

## **RFRI conducts Training for Forest Range Officer Trainees**

RFRI conducted a training programme for Trainee Forest Range Officers of 2016-18 batch from Central Academy of Forest Education, Kurseong, Darjeeling, West Bengal from 2<sup>nd</sup> January to 6<sup>th</sup> January, 2017. There were 37 trainees who were led by Mr. C. A. Rahman, Lecturer, CASFOS, Burnihat.

Dr. R. K. Borah, Director (i/c), RFRI, Jorhat welcomed the Trainees and expressed his New Year greetings. He told that the entire training programme was planned to meet the requirements of the trainees so that they can deliver the knowledge for better services to the forestry sector.

Dr. Bijon Dutta, Professor of Assam Agriculture University, Jorhat was invited as Guest Faculty to deliver presentation on Management of Insect problems in Forestry. He very lucidly explained various principles and practices on insect management in forestry. He also taught rodent control.

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


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
